2021 PROCLAMATION of EARTH DAY in the City of Lafayette

The first Earth Day was celebrated on April 22, 1970, inspired by

sustainability efforts; and

2021 PROCLAMATION of ARBOR DAY in the City of Lafayette

WHEREAS: In 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed "Arbor Day" to recognize the

importance of trees in our lives, and

WHEREAS: In 1989, Johanna Downie, Lafayette Council woman had the

foresight and vision to author Lafayette's Tree Ordinance, to protect

Lafayette's street trees, promote planting and education, and

WHEREAS: Trees are a necessary component of our healthful existence, and

contribute to the quality of life by purifying the atmosphere, moderating temperatures, and providing seasonal beauty, and

WHEREAS: In December of 2015, the United Nations signed the Paris Climate

Agreement. The Paris Agreement promotes more trees being

planted in the cities of the world, and

WHEREAS: As development consumes more and more open land, the planting of

more trees takes on greater importance, and

WHEREAS: Trees contribute to our nation's natural resources, by providing fuel,

shelter and food in a form that, through proper management and use,

can remain renewable for the use of future generations, and

WHEREAS: Trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and

storm water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the

temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide

habitat for wildlife, and

WHEREAS: Trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic

vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and

WHEREAS: The citizens of the City of Lafayette join the thousands of other

Americans who will commemorate this special day by planting trees

and celebrating the importance of trees in our lives,

NOW THEREFORE:

I, Tony Roswarski, Mayor of the City of Lafayette do hereby

proclaim Saturday, May 1st, 2021 as the observance of:

ARBOR DAY in the City of Lafayette
